## Air Quality and EDB/ESF/Kennedy School Policy

Earlier this week we had two days where the air quality throughout Hong Kong was very poor and we had a number of parents contact our school nurse in relation to Kennedy school's procedure and policies. Please [click here](#) for the official guidelines from the Hong Kong Education Department which we follow closely. The air levels are monitored on an hourly basis throughout the day and we make immediate decisions based on the current level. For example, on Tuesday we limited all physical exertion at break and lunchtimes and moved our sports extra curricular activities inside. The air inside the school is the same as the air outside so the important action we follow is to reduce or avoid physical exertion during these days.

## Police Road Warning

I met (again) with the local Police Department and they have informed me that they will be more vigilant in issuing parking infringement notices before and after school so, if possible, please avoid parking illegally (which is everywhere!) near the school at these times. Unfortunately, there is a very small number of nearby residents who report the parking issue to the police and they are obligated to take action. We also discussed ways that the police may be able to help us with the issue of speeding cars coming down the hill from Sha Wan Drive.

Mr Luck is also going to attempt the Lantau Two Peaks Run which is a 1971m ascent over 23km.

This is in aid of his friend's daughter Eliana. Eliana was born prematurely and suffered brain damage. This has caused a visual impairment and Diplegic Cerebral Palsy. She is a potential candidate for a spinal cord operation called Selective Dhorsal Rhizotomy. It is a spinal cord operation that could eliminate the spasticity in her legs. It's not available on the NHS and her best hope is to have the operation in St Louis, USA. If she is selected for the op she will also require intensive Physiotherapy for a year after the operation. This will give Eliana the best chance of living a full life.

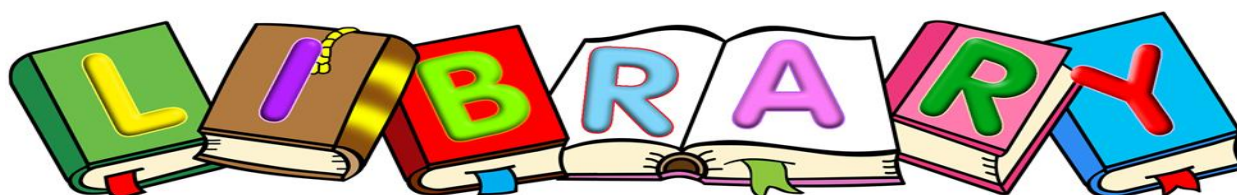

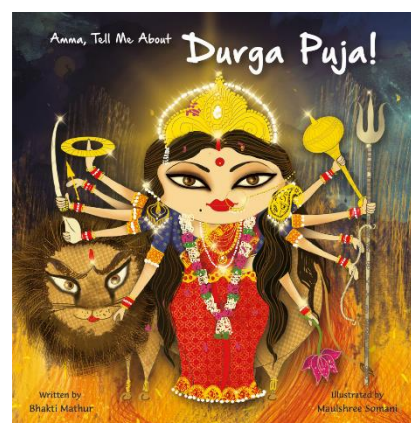


## Scholastic Reading Club

# FROM THE PE DEPARTMENT



## Kennedy School Swim Safety Week

This week the children will be receiving a practical lesson on water safety. If you child has two swimming classes during the week beginning Monday 3rd October the first lesson will have the Swim Safety focus.

The Swim Safety Week is a big safety component to our swimming programme and where we introduce the students to how it feels to be fully clothed when swimming. The children will also experience basic life saving techniques should they fall into a body of water. During Water Safety Week students will learn to carry out reach rescues and rope throwing, plus safe entries and treading water - don't miss out on learning these invaluable skills next week.

The programme is designed to allow the students to experience how their swimming ability may change when in water with heavier clothes on. For the students to experience the change in the way they float, how much more tired they become, and survival techniques to use IF they were to be in water fully clothed, such as falling off a boat, being caught in a flash flood, accidentally falling into a pool etc.

The students need to bring in the following clothes IN ADDITION to their usual swim kit:

Y2: white t-shirt

Y3&4: light coloured baggy shorts and white long sleeved T-shirt

Y5&6: light coloured tracksuit/pyjama bottoms and white long sleeved T-shirt.

Only white or light coloured clothing will be permitted in the pool as dark colours and print reacts with the chlorine.

Following our information about the use of wet suits and rash tops in the cooler weather, please ensure that your child has a good sized towel to wrap themselves up in after swimming.

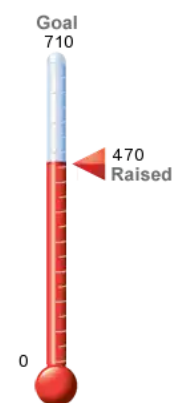
A big thank you to Mr. Dray, Mr. Crompton and Mr. Tremmel for their support training and running the teams.
